## National Youth Coalition for Housing (NYCH) finalised

After much deliberation, the NYCH Board has decided to finalise NYCH as an entity and hand over the remaining assets and Youth Homelessness Matters Day Campaign management to Yfoundations.

For more than 20 years, NYCH has brought together representatives from each state to form a collective voice that has advocated and lobbied for a national plan to end youth homelessness. The coalition has brought together generations of leaders and advocates in the youth homelessness space and provided a space for sharing ideas and knowledge across the country. For significant periods of its history, NYCH received funding to undertake various activities and coordinate the national voice.

Over the last few years, this has proven difficult, with the loss of funding for homelessness peaks and a heavy reliance on the time of volunteer board members. NYCH has shifted to prioritising its members' time and remaining financial resources into driving the YHMD Campaign each year. Despite the challenges faced by NYCH, YHMD has continued to grow in reach and awareness and has become an important opportunity to raise the voice and experiences of young people across the country.

In 2020, the NYCH board reflected on its role and capacity to function as an Incorporated Association with the obligations that underpin such an organisational structure. A consensus has been reached by the board that a more sustainable future is needed, one that preserves a collective national voice and can drive YHMD each year without the significant administrative burden that its membership currently holds.

Yfoundations is the peak body for youth homelessness in NSW, whilst also holding national influence in the homeless space. Yfoundations CEO Pam Barker has been the Co-chair of NYCH alongside Andrew Kazim for the last 18 months.

Nerida Ackerman, Yfoundations President, says "the invitation to manage the YHMD campaign is an honour for Yfoundations. We are excited to support Youth Homelessness Matters Day nationally. We have a long history and involvement with NYCH, it makes sense for us to manage the national campaign moving forward. We thank the NYCH Board for their management over the last 25 years, we look forward to launching the YHMD campaign in April 2022".

Yfoundations Board will be calling on national sector homelessness representatives in the coming months to form a national advisory to support the YHMD 2022 campaign.

Yfoundations is the peak body for youth homelessness in NSW. It represents young people at risk of and experiencing homelessness in NSW, and also represents the services that provide direct support to children and young people.
